SCHOOL DAY

School times are as follows:

9.05am - 12.00pm.

1.00pm - 3.00pm.

Children should arrive at school between 8.50-9.05 am. On arrival they go straight into their classrooms to start the school day.

Out of School Care

Uniform

We expect to see all children wearing school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform promotes a sense of

pride in the school; and engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school. Many items are available to purchase at the school office. Not all items are compulsory, although we expect children to wear a red sweatshirt or cardigan and P.E. T-shirt even if you do not wish to buy one with the school logo. The rest of the uniform can be purchased at normal clothing outlets.

School meals and snacks

Children have the choice of either a hot nutritious meal from our school meals service or bringing a healthy packed lunch into school. School dinners are provided by Whole School Meals and are cooked at Sandwich Junior School before being transported to us and kept in a heated cabinet.

Free school meals

We are happy to say that all pupils can have a free school meal.

Break-time and drinks

Under the Fruit in School Scheme all children are entitled to a piece of fruit each day free of charge. This is given as a playtime snack. Water is available throughout the day although children are encouraged to bring to school a plastic water bottle.

Milk is provided free to pupils under five and those who are eligible to receive free school meals. Milk is available to other pupils through the Milk in Schools Scheme for a small charge.

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CURRICULUM: CREATIVE AND REWARDING

Learning is fun!

Our priority is to ensure the whole experience of school and learning, is fun for our children. We want all our children to look forward to, and enjoy, school. The EYFS and KS1 teachers each collaborate to ensure we offer a balanced and stimulating curriculum.

1. Early Years Foundation Stage: from ages 0-5 2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7

INCLUSION: A CURRICULUM FOR ALL

Special Educational Needs

At Sandwich Infant School we can make provision for every kind of frequently occurring special educational need without an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Monitoring

We monitor the pupils to review their academic progress. We also use a range of assessments with all the pupils at various points. Where progress is not as expected, we put in place extra support to enable the pupil to catch up. Examples of extra support are small group work with a teacher or teaching assistant (TA) and 1:1 support with a teacher or TA.

External advisors

We also have access to external advisors such as the Kent Specialist Teaching Service, the local Speech and Language Therapy and Paediatric assessment services, who are able to use more specialist assessments. These detailed assessments will identify what additional resources and different

approaches are required to enable the pupil to make better progress. These will be shared with parents, put into an EHC support plan, reviewed regularly and revised if necessary.

Gifted and talented children

We recognise that all children are individuals with their own specific needs, gifts and talents. Children who are identified as being exceptionally able or talented, are monitored and provided with stimulating and enriching lessons appropriate to their needs.

YOUR CHILD'S ACHIEVEMENTS

Ongoing assessments

Throughout the year teachers assess and record your child's achievement in all the National Curriculum subjects. We focus on a range of statements which, over the years, will enable you to build up a picture of your child's progress. We also tell you the National Curriculum level for reading, writing and maths.

Progress

As well as demonstrating your child's progress, this assessment helps teachers to plan appropriate activities and lessons for your child's next unit of work. Children in Reception class are assessed against the Foundation Stage Profile.

School reports

All parents receive an annual written report from the class teacher at the end of the summer term which provides information about your child's academic achievement and summarises their personal and social development. You are welcome to arrange to see the teacher at other times if you have particular questions.

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CLUBS

From reading, to sewing and dancing... just join in!

We arrange a variety of clubs according to the time of year and the interests of the children. Examples of our clubs include:

The majority of clubs are offered to Years One and Two as the younger children are too tired when they first start school.

Sport

The physical development of young children is extremely important. Pupils take part in games, gymnastics and dance.



Sports Week

During the summer term we enjoy Sports Week where children experience a different sport everyday which have previously included:

Sports Premium

We have used our pupil premium funding to pay for Team Theme to come into school and coach Year One and Year Two once a week.

They also provide training to improve the skills of our staff.

Sandwich Junior School

At the end of Year Two most children transfer to Sandwich Junior School. The headteacher of the junior school is happy for parents to visit that school before a decision is made to apply for a place at the Infant School.

Preparing to start school for the first time

Entering school for the first time is a big step in a child's life and our aim is to make this step as smooth as possible both for you and your child. So we hold meetings during the summer term, prior to the children starting school and again in September. This is a great opportunity to share information and respond to any concerns. Children start school on a part time basis in the second and third week of term.

Admission into Reception

All children in the Kent area can attend fulltime education in the September following their fourth birthday. However, children do not have to go to school full-time until the term after their fifth birthday if their parents or carers do not want them to, as this is the compulsory school age. To apply for your child's Reception school place at Sandwich Infant School, you will need to follow Kent Council's procedures for admission. The closing date for September applications is in mid January of that year. Full details are available on their website and you can apply

Admission into other year groups

For children joining the school after the beginning of the Reception year, parents and pupils are encouraged to visit the school and meet the Headteacher. Applications should be made to the school via an In Year Admission Form available from www.kent. gov.uk and click on the link to 'Education and children'-'school places'. If you do not have access to the internet please contact the school for a copy.

Parental Involvement
