Session 1  Drawing	What different lines can you create with pencils and are there different pencils?  NC - become proficient in drawing	-To know that soft pencils create darker lines and are marked with a B for black. Hard pencils create lighter lines and are marked with an H for hard.  -To know that different types of line include zigzag, wavy, curved, thick and thin.	-Use soft and hard pencils to create different types of line and shape.  -Begins sketching natural and man-made objects	Pencil, line, thick, thin, wavy, straight, hard, zigzag, soft	Sketching Warm Up  Children practise different types of line in their sketch books with both hard and soft pencils.  Children practise drawing an object. Session 2  Learn about art	What is a portrait and what features do you need to draw?  NC - evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design	To know that a portrait is a piece of artwork representing a person  A human face includes features, such as eyes, nose, mouth, forehead, eyebrows and cheeks.	Represent the human face, using drawing, from observation with some attention to facial features.	Human, body, head, neck, face, arms, legs, hands, feet, fingers, toes, eyes, nose, mouth, portrait, forehead, eyebrows, cheeks.
