| Session 1 Learn about art | What Materials are easy to shape and to make a sculpture with? NC - evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design NC - become proficient in sculpture | Malleable materials, such as clay, plasticine or salt dough, are easy to shape. | Learn about artists, designers and crafts people | Who is Alberto Giacometti and what materials does he create artwork from? NC - know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms. NC - evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design | To know that Alberto Giacometti was a swiss artist who began painting, drawing, and sculpting from a very early age and explored many art forms throughout his life. To know that he is most famous for his sculptures of human form made in bronze. To know that sculpture can be made from all the resources around us To know that an artists work influences others. | Talk about how Giacometti created his sculptures. Children to add notes linked to the class discussion and their own thoughts and opinions.
