Session 1	How is the world divided into continents?  NC Link: use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage	Know that a continent is a mainland of islands.	Able to name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.  Knows that there are 7 continents in the world, and they are North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Antarctica, Asia and Australasia.	Continent, Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America and South America.	Have a picture of the world split into continents in books. Children to write a sentence for each continent (or to be scribed by an adult).  EG: France is in Europe. China is in Asia.	Map of the world Globe Atlases Picture of the world split into continents.	Recap lesson from Term 1 (in more depth). Explain to the children that the 7 continents of the world are made up of different countries. Show the children hot to use an atlas to find a country that is in each continent.
Session 2	What are the 5 main Oceans of the world?  NC Link: use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage	Know that there are 5 main oceans in the World, all of which surround the UK.	Able to name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.  Know that they are the Atlantic, Pacific, Indian, Southern and Arctic Oceans.	ocean, Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Southern Ocean and Arctic Ocean.	Children to have a map of the world and label the oceans.	Map of the world Globe	Recap Lesson from Term 1 (in more depth). Have a map of the world split into continents. Explain that the continents of the world are surrounded by 5 oceans. Label the oceans of the world onto the map.
Session 3	What are famous landmarks around the world?  NC Link: use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage	To know the world has many famous landmarks, including: England-Stonehenge, France - Eiffel Tower in France, Asia - Great wall of China, Australia – Sydney Harbour Bridge.	Able to name famous landmarks around the world.	landmarks	Children to have pictures of famous landmarks. Write a sentence about which continent each landmark is found in.	Map of the World Pictures of landmarks from each continent.	Show the children different landmarks from around the world.
Session 4	What countries make up the UK?  NC Link:  name, locate and identify  characteristics of the four countries  and capital cities of the United  Kingdom and its surrounding seas.	Know that England, Scotland, Northern Island and Wales make up the UK.	Able to name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.  Know that each of these countries has a capital city and a flag. Know that the capital city of the UK is London. Know that the capital city of Scotland is Edinburgh. Know that the capital city of Wales is Cardiff. Know that the capital city of Northern Ireland is Belfast.	UK, England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland,	Label a map of the UK with the names of the countries and their Capital Cities.	Map of the UK.	Have a map of the UK on the board/flipchart. Ask the children if they know the names of the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom. Add them to the map. Explain capital cities and that every country in the world has one. See if the children can name any capital cities and add Cardiff, London, Edinburgh and Belfast to the map.

Session 5	What Seas make up the UK?  NC Link:  name, locate and identify  characteristics of the four countries  and capital cities of the United  Kingdom and its surrounding seas.	Know that Great Britain is an island. It is surrounded by seas: to the south by the English Channel, which separates it from continental Europe. • to the east by the North Sea. • to the west by the Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.	Able to name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.	North Atlantic, North Sea, English Channel, Irish Sea.	Children to add to their maps of the UK by labelling the different seas that surround it.	Map of the UK (from previous lesson to be added to).	Have a map of the UK on the board/flipchart.  Explain that the UK has seas that surround it and add them to the map.
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
