The weather in Kenya is different to the weather in the UK. IT has two seasons: dry and rainy. Oct-Nov is the rainy season, whereas the rest is dry.

Session 4 Similarities and differences	What are the physical differences between the Nyiri Desert and Sandwich?	As there is such a long period of dry weather, there are a range of different landscapes – wetlands, grasslands, forests and Savannah. The UK does not have a desert because it does not have the right climate. The key differences include: - rivers - Vegetation - Density of population - Animals and plants	Understand the processes that give rise to key physical geographical features of the world. Eg: The Nyiri desert is dry because it hardly ever rains and there is no water but in Sandwich it rains often and there is a beach and a river.
