CAR PARK

As we strive to maintain a smooth and efficient dropoff and pick-up process for our wraparound care (Fun Club), we kindly remind you not to park in the staff car park during these times unless you have gained approval from myself for exceptional circumstances. The staff car park is reserved exclusively for our staff, who need reliable access to their parking spaces to ensure they can perform their duties without interruption. To facilitate a safe and orderly drop off and pick up, we ask that you park either in the Co-op car park or at Gazen Salts. This will help to accommodate the flow of traffic during busy times and ensure the safety of all children and families.

UNIFORM

We offer pre-loved uniform that is available to purchase for £1 an item (unless marked otherwise). If you would like to view the pre-loved clothing, these will be out on our open afternoons and throughout various FOSIS event, but can also be viewed upon request from the school office.

ATTENDANCE

Our updated Trust Attendance Policy can be found on our school website. Our attendance target for this academic year is 100%.

We believe that regular attendance is the key to enabling children to gain the greatest benefit from their education and reach their full potential. Children are expected to attend school every day that the school is open unless they are unwell or there is an exceptional circumstance which has been approved.

Our morning register will be taken at 8:40. If your child is unwell, it is important that you contact us on the first day that they are unwell, before 10:00, by calling the school office on 01304 612228 or 01304 613358.

This is a safeguarding issue requirement so that all parties know that your child is safe and their whereabouts is known. You must inform us every day that your child is off. You must also provide us with a reason for the absence so this can be recorded.

All children that arrive late (after 8:40) must report, with their parent to the school office, where the reason for lateness will be recorded.

Children repeatedly arriving after the register has closed will be marked as late after registration and this will count as an unauthorised absence.

Frequent lateness will be discussed and could be grounds for prosecution or a penalty notice.

When your child's attendance dips below 90%, you will receive a letter from myself, highlighting you that this is perceived as a 'persistent absence'.

MCAS

It is important that every parent downloads and uses the MCAS (My Child at School) app as this is our primary form of communication. You will receive notifications, texts and emails from the school via this app (please note that emails are sent to your personal email account, and text messages go through the app).

Our main preference of delivery is through notifications as this means everything will appear in the app. You will also receive a notification on your phone when communication has been sent, however you must have notifications enabled on your phone.

If you know of any parents that are having trouble with the app, please ask them to speak to the school office where we can offer support with this. Please also check that you have recently updated the app and have checked that your contact details are correct.

MCAS will also be used to book your Parents Evening appointment, pay for trips and booking wraparound care (Fun Club).

CLUBS

We will continue to offer a range of extra-curricular activities to the children this year, both during lunchtimes, as part of the school day, and as after-school activities.

During Term 1 lunchtimes, Year 1 and 2 will have the opportunity to attend the following clubs:

READING

Please support your child in hearing them read at home every day. This year we will be investing more money into our reading scheme, so that the books that they read in 'Reading Practice' are shared at home with you. This is important in building children's confidence in reading, as well as supporting their comprehension and ability to infer.

BEHAVIOUR

Our first teacher training day took place on Monday with all schools in Aquila Multi-academy trust. The focus was on behaviour and was led by the fantastic Tom Bennett. Tom currently leads the Department for Education's Behaviour Hubs project and therefore has much knowledge and experience in the subject.

Our updated behaviour policy has a couple of tweaks this year, specifically detailing the 'norms and routines' within school. Our whole school approach to behaviour will continue this year, and all members of staff will teach and reinforce the appropriate behaviours for learning throughout the year. We would appreciate your support in reinforcing our 'norms and routines' with your children as these take place as soon as the children enter the school gate:

- Children get off bikes and scooters before entering the school gate. They are placed in the correct, allocated spaces on the playground
- Children are not permitted to use the trim trail before the start of the school because of insurance purposes
- Children wait behind the yellow lines with their parents (incase the door opens on them)
- Parents stay until their child has been welcomed into the class by their teacher
- Reception children (and siblings) do not play with the resources that have been set up for the day in the Reception areas
- Adults (school staff) greet the children at the door at the beginning of the school day (8:35–8:40)

SCHOOL UNIFORM

School uniform can be purchased through Price and Buckland, however we are happy for the children to wear clothing without our school logo.

- * Trainers and boots should not be worn. We ask that the children are able to manage their shoes independently, so lace up shoes are not suitable.

All clothes must be clearly marked with your child's name. Jewellery is not permitted although stud earrings can be worn if these can be removed by the child on P.E. days.

PENCIL CASES
